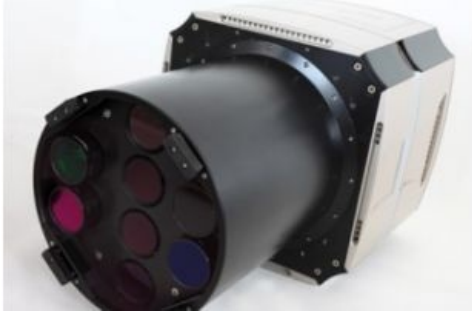


Aero-Graphics Buys UltraCam Eagle with UltraNav
